



## MEDIA EDUCATION IN HARYANA

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**Abstract-** Media education in Haryana is approachable in the same way as the thrust areas, which provide an opportunity to media students to understand and prepare for a career in media education and media. Media teaching schools in Haryana Colleges are being established in universities, the state is developing itself internally and externally through the students passed out from these educational institutions. The media education of Haryana has been elaborately highlighted through the presented research.

**Key word-** Haryana, Media Education, school, college, university, religion, hire, etc.

**Haryana Geographical Region** - Kerala in terms of Haryana state area. It is smaller in size than the rest of the states of India except Tripura, Meghalaya, Goa, Nagaland, Mizoram, Sikkim and Manipur. The population of this state is more than Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir. Haryana is situated in the north-west of India between 27°39'55"N latitude and 74.28.77.36 E longitude. Its altitude ranges from 700 to 3600 feet (200 m to 1200 m) above sea level. The outer boundaries are Punjab and Himachal to the north and Rajasthan to the south. Along the northern border are Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh bordering the Yamuna. While Haryana is surrounded by the country's capital Delhi on three sides. Due to which North, East and South are known as National Capital Region (NCR).

**Population and religious status** - According to the 2011 census, on the basis of religious status in the state of Haryana, Hindu is 87.55 percent, Muslim 7.03 percent, Sikh 4.91 percent, Buddhism 0.03 percent, Jainism 0.21 percent, the number of other religions is 0.18 percent. Hindus constitute 88.23 percent of the total population of Haryana, their population is 18,655,925. Muslims are on the second number with a population of 1,222,196. The total population of Sikhs is 1,70,662, the total population of Jains is 57,167. Christians have a population of 27,185, Buddhists 7140. There is 19.3 percent scheduled caste in the state. The sex ratio of the state is 879 females per 1000 males. Which holds 30th position in decreasing proportion in the whole country.

**Bhaddha and Boli** - Hindi language and dialect speaking people in Haryana Pradesh 47.96 percent, Haryanvi 37.17 percent, Punjabi 7.36 percent, Bangadi 2.11 percent, Mewati 1.66 percent, Urdu 1.48 percent and Bagheti 1.28 percent people reside. Apart from this, Ahirwati dialect is spoken in the state.

**Status of Education in Haryana-** Formation of Haryana. After 1 November 1966 there was a significant increase in the educational structure. The hardworking people of Haryana donated their lands for the development of the country and the state. Education Policy-1968, Second Education Policy-1986 have been adopted to provide mass education in India, along with this India has adopted New Education Policy-2020. has been started which has been implemented in 2022. Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra has implemented it for the first time in the country in its campus.

**According to Haryana Directorate of Higher Education at present-** There are 56(23,000)49

students, 20-21 p.a.) universities including 01 central university, 21 state universities (14,6,112 students,21-22 p.a.) and 24 private universities (54,752 students, 20-21 p.a.) 11 other universities ( 29,185students, 20–21 increments). The governor of Haryana is the chancellor of the state universities and the chancellor of private universities. 177 Government Degree Colleges (2,19,024 students, 22-23 p.a.), 02 Government Education Colleges, 97 Government Aided Degree Colleges (1,37,319 students, 22-23 p.a.) and 94 Self-Financed Degree Colleges (31, 334 students, 22-23 p.a.). 22-23 (yearly) are colleges. There are 26 Government Polytechnics, 03 Government Aided Polytechnics, 11 Government Society Polytechnics, 147 Private Polytechnics. 4 Government Engineering Colleges, 77 Private Engineering Colleges of state government. There is an active policy of opening government colleges within a radius of 20 km to admit all students, especially girls. Haryana, on the other hand, has 15,592 schools under different types of government schooling, while 10,195 schools run under different types of private schooling. Are.

**Media Teaching in Government Universities** - Website of the University Grants Commission (UGC) working under the Ministry of Education, Government of India (As on 1.02.2023), a total of 1043 universities are providing their services in the dues. Giving information to Honorable Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, he said that at present 50 thousand graduates and more than 50 thousand post-graduates pass the examination in the whole country. Quoting the Speaker, he has demanded the Honorable Central Government to accept his demand in this regard. In this regard, this demand has been raised for many years, and positive results can come in this direction in the future. Along with this, a list of those universities of Haryana is being given for the attention of the readers, where the School of Mass Communication and Journalism has been established and in these universities, guest, Contractual, Permanent assistant professors, associate professors, professors are appointed. .

According to the Constitution of India (see Article-16 (4)), the state in which the society has been given representation according to their numbers in higher education. In the state of Haryana, it is below that representation (OBC-27% and SC-20%). In this regard, the concerned professors of the universities will have to pay proper attention so that both the classes can be developed by giving proper representation in the field of higher education. In this regard, students interested in future research work of both these classes will also have to pay attention to their proper representation, because for the representation they have got today, eminent educated people related to them have given their valuable lives.

**Conclusion**

Media education has been established in most of the districts in Haryana.

1. If we say in this regard that from north to southThrough regular and distance education in schools, government and non-government colleges, government and non-university established from east to west, media education is conducted in elective subjects, diploma, graduation, post-graduation,Ph.D courses.
2. The trend of government and non-government educational institutions has increased towards media education.Because in this era of technology, immense platforms of information have been established. The demand for diploma and degree holders in the media for all these platforms has increased more than before.

3. Student interest in careers in media education is wider than ever, Because the demand for media teachers is increasing in media educational institutions established in the state.
4. According to this research in media education, three universities of the state, including Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Hisar, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak More than 1000 students from the respective departments of mass communication have passed their post graduate degree through regular course.
5. Thousands of students have passed post graduate degree from the distance education directorates of these departments. Apart from this, regular postgraduate degrees from newly established state and non- state universities in the state are included separately.
6. Three universities of the state in which Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Guru Jambheshwar University of Science and Technology, Hisar, Maharshi Dayanand University Rohtak, more than 169 students have passed their Ph.D degree from the respective Departments of Mass Communication. With this there are more than 100 Ph.D students registered in the same departments. The same number of research scholars who have passed Ph.D degree from other state and non-state universities are included separately.
7. Number of Permanent teachers in state universities-25, Number of Contractual teachers-30, Number of part-time teachers-18, Number of teachers in government senior secondary schools-18 are included. Apart from this, the number of Permanent teachers in government colleges is 27, and the number of extension lecture teachers in government colleges is 13. Along with this, the number of teachers working in private colleges and universities is different.
8. Mass communication course is being run in nine government universities of the state. The number of Contractual and part time teachers in these universities is 48. These teachers have been teaching in these universities for about 5 to 10 years, but they are kept away from research work, so that research in mass communication is dependent only on Permanent teachers. Due to this, the talent of the Contractual media teachers is being violated, as well as their social and economic status is also being violated. For this reason, the work that should have been done in the field of mass communication in the state in the form of research can be better than at present. So far, the subjects related to mass communication and journalism working under the Directorate of Higher Education, Haryana Recruitment has been done for 27 posts. According to the serial number in the roster made related to this relation (see Article-16(4) of the Constitution), appointments of candidates belonging to other backward classes and scheduled castes have been made for general categories. A case has also been filed in this regard in the Punjab and Haryana High Court. The case number of this filed case is CPW 16811-2016. (In this context, the date has been given from February 2016 to September 2023 only, with this, in February 2016, the Haryana Directorate of Higher Education released the result for the appointment of 6 new assistant professors while the case was pending.) private colleges of the state Most of the temporary media teachers are also working in universities, who also do not get the same pay scale. Action lectures in government colleges and universities of the state, Guest Faculty, Part Time Teachers, Contract Teachers, Self Finance Scheme Teachers and Permanent Teachers are working.
9. Teachers are working with different names in state universities, Which mainly include Permanent teachers, teachers working under self finance scheme, Contractual teachers, part time teachers, teaching assistants, guest faculty. Haryana Holistic Contracted Teachers Association has been formed for the benefit of Contractual teachers, part time teachers,



teaching assistants, guest faculty working in state universities, under which more than 1000 teachers are registered.

10. Undoubtedly, there is no doubt that the media educational institutions of Haryana have To take the state and the country forward continuously, journalists, editors, editors and publishers, public relations officers, writers and innumerable youths working in other fields have been provided. Along with this, it is also definitely true that in these media education institutions, talented students coming from the society of other backward classes, scheduled castes have been sidelined to represent them according to their numbers in higher education i.e. Ph.D and media education. It is hoped that those who could not do so will adopt honesty in their personality and higher educational qualification in present and future. With this, all the society will get proper representation and with proper representation, the society, the state and the country will progress equally.

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
